CERVICAL CANCER IS A PREVENTABLE DISEASE. SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA CARRIES A HIGH BURDEN OF CERVICAL CANCER DISEASE. OVER THE COURSE OF TWO DAYS, LEADING EXPERTS WILL PRESENT NEW KNOWLEDGE AND LESSONS LEARNED ON CERVICAL CANCER PREVENTION RESEARCH AND IMPLEMENTATION FOR THE SUB-SAHARAN AFRICAN CONTEXT.
